With his family, Dave moved to the Chicago area, then to Wisconsin and a brief stint in Las Vegas, where he fulfilled jobs as both a theatre organist and a church musician. Dave has also toured in Australia and New Zealand, and currently lives in Michigan, from where he concertizes extensively in the United States.

CAROL WILLIAMS

Raised in a musical Welsh family, Dr. Williams could read music before English. While at the Royal Academy of Music, she was awarded all major prizes for organ and became Fellow of the Royal College of Organists. Carol has performed for Princess Diana, Virgil Fox Memorial, 10th anniversary of the Walt Disney Concert Hall Organ as well as in many countries worldwide. Williams delivers a diverse musical experience from heavy classical to theatrical, popular, and jazz organ. Presently Carol is Artist in Residence and Organist at Peachtree Christian Church in Atlanta and Artistic Director of Viscount North America.

JERRY NAGANO

Born and raised in the Los Angeles area where he began his musical training, Jerry studied with organist Gaylord Carter, whom he first heard performing during a silent movie show. During his college years, Jerry was the organist for the Pasadena Civic Auditorium. After relocating to the Bay Area, he was the featured artist at Ye Olde Pizza Joynt in San Lorenzo, the first "Wurlitzer in the Pizza Parlor" in the Bay Area. Since those days Jerry has played at the Stanford Theater, the Oakland Paramount and the California Theatre in San Jose. In 2017 he was named Theater Organist of the Year by the American Theatre Organ Society.

SIMON GLEDHILL



Another Dickinson Favorite... After starting his musical education on classical piano and organ, Simon fell in love with theatre organ after hearing the famous Wurlitzer at the Tower Ballroom in Blackpool. He was the ATOS Organist of the year in 1997, inducted into the Society's Hall of Fame in 2015, and has also toured worldwide. Simon has performed at all the major theatre organ venues in Britain, as well as touring in Europe, the USA, Canada, Australia and New Zealand. He combines his performing and recording activities with work for the Cinema Organ Society and a full-time career in finance, based in London.
